

## **Eyebrow Aftercare**

Usually there is very little swelling and redness with permanent eyebrows. Apply cold compresses as necessary if you do have swelling. Ice is too cold, just cold water on a clean washcloth or paper towel,

You will need to apply the after care ointment provided or Vaseline, Aquaphor, or A&D ointment to the area twice daily for 7 days. You do not need antibiotic ointment unless you feel you might be getting an infection. If you think you need antibiotic ointment please call me first so I can make sure it is necessary.

Your eyebrows will form a crust or scab over them. This is Natures Bandage and is keeping the color intact as it heals into the skin. Do not pick this crust off or you will reopen the wound to possible infection and it will make your color heal unevenly.

Your brows will appear about 30-40% darker for the first few days until your brow is healed completely, the crust will naturally come off as the wound heals.

Do not scrub the area as it will make the crust come off prematurely. Use a mild cleanser and pat dry.

Keep fragranced lotions, and cleansers with exfoliants and alpha hydroxy products away from your brows while healing.

Once healed use sunscreen over your brows if you will be in the sun for any length of time as it can make your brow fade faster.

You can wear makeup around, but not on top of your brows until healed, at least a week. You can shampoo normally.

Never apply peroxide or steroid cream on healing permanent makeup.

**DO NOT call me every day to see if they will get lighter...!!!!**  
It is a process and you may feel like they are too dark for the first few days until they heal!

Avoid direct sun, salt water and chlorine for 10 days after service!
